## Congressional Chronicle

The political landscape has changed with the 115th Congress. Not only are there 33 new Republicans and 28 new Democrats in the House, there's also 3 new Republicans and 5 new Democrat in the Senate. Keep track of the members of Congress using Congressional Chronicle on c-span.org. The Congressional Chronicle page has an abundance of useful information, including voting results and statistics about each session of Congress on C-SPAN, C-SPAN2, C-SPAN Radio, and c-span.org.

**C-SPAN** was launched in 1979 to provide live, gavel-to-gavel coverage of the U.S. House of Representatives.

**C-SPAN 2** was created in 1986 to provide live, gavel-to-gavel coverage of the U.S. Senate.

**C-SPAN 3** was launched in 2001 and provides another choice in public affairs programming.

The C-SPAN networks were created by the cable industry and are offered as a public service to provide access to balanced, commercial-free coverage of the American political process. The networks are privately funded by the cable industry, without government or taxpayer support. All three networks are now available in HD.
